<b>White Pine:</b> (1.5-3') Large evergreen used in windbreaks or visual screens. Soft-looking needles. Great as specimen or in mass plantings. (H: 80', W: 40', fast growing, full sun, moist well drained soil)	\$20.00		
<b>Colorado Blue Spruce:</b> (1.5-2') Stiff, silvery-blue to green needles are 1 inch long. Handsome ornamental specimen in single planting or dense, colorful screen or windbreak. Space 6 feet apart. Ordinary soil, average moisture. (H: 50', W: 25', slow to medium growth, full to partial sun, moist soil)	\$22.00		
<b>Norway Spruce:</b> (2-3') Dense, dark, short needles. Branches droop gracefully as tree matures. (H: 80', W: 40', medium to fast growth, full to partial sun, moist well drained soil)	\$20.00		
<b>Red Maple 'October Glory':</b> (3') Leaves are only red in the fall. Broad oval crown with glossy green foliage in the summer that turns crimson red in the fall. The red colored leaf is one of the longest lasting in the fall. (H: 60', W: 40', medium to fast growth, full to partial sun, moist to wet soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Scarlet Oak:</b> (3') Stately shade or street tree. Drought tolerant. Excellent fall color. Great choice near urbanized areas. (H: 70', W: 50', medium to fast growth, full to partial sun, dry soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Swamp White Oak:</b> (3-4') Striking & powerful looking. Underside of leaves are white. Leaves turn varied shades in fall from bronze to yellow. Prefers moist, acidic soils. (H: 60', W: 60', slow to medium growth, partial to full sun, moist soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Eastern Redbud:</b> (2-3') Native favorite and harbinger of spring that explodes with rosy pink flowers in April. (H: 30', W: 10', medium growth, full to partial sun, moist soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Ohio Buckeye:</b> (1') State Tree. Primarily found in understory. Large spikes of green-yellow spring flowers are followed by the familiar, shiny brown seed. (H: 60', W: 30', medium growth, full sun to partial shade, full shade at maturity, moist well drained soil)	\$19.00		
<b>Flowering Dogwood:</b> (3-4') Native tree with distinctive white spring flowers on horizontal branches. Clusters of glossy red fruit in fall persist into winter and are relished by birds. Consistent deep red fall leaf color. (H: 15', W: 20', slow growth, full sun to full shade, moist well drained soil)	\$20.00		
<b>Jane Magnolia:</b> (2-3') Broad rounded tree magnolia with reddish-purple flowers that are white on the inside and appear before glossy deciduous foliage. (H: 10', W: 10', slow growth, full to partial sun, moist well drained soils)	\$18.00		
<b>River Birch:</b> (2-3') Beautiful, exfoliating, reddish-brown to silvery-gray bark. Grow as single trunk or as a multi-stemmed tree. Fall leaf color is yellow. (H: 50', W: 40', rapid growth, full to partial sun, moist to wet soils)	\$20.00		
<b>Fringetree:</b> (2-3') Shimmering, white fringed flowers cover the tree in May or June followed by small, round fall fruit on female trees. Leaves often turn bright yellow in fall. Plant as single specimen or in groups. (H: 15', W: 15', shade to partial shade)	\$20.00		

<b>Dawn Redwood:</b> (3-4') A deciduous tree that looks like the Sequoia or Coast Redwood, both in growth habit and foliage. Soft, bright green needles turning brown in fall. (H: 80', W: 25', fast growing, full sun to full shade, moist soils)	\$18.00		
<b>Bald Cypress:</b> (2-3') A deciduous conifer with medium-fine needle-like leaves that are soft-textured and light green in summer but turn rusty brown in winter before they drop. Great choice for compacted, urban sites. (H: 60', W: 25', moderate growth, full sun to shade, wet to dry soils)	\$18.00		
<b>Black Gum:</b> (1-1.5') Rivals anything for fall color with spectrum of glowing shades. Fruit is favored by many birds. (H: 40', W: 25', slow to medium growth rate, full sun to partial shade, well drained soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Paw Paw:</b> (3-4') Multi-stemmed shrub or small tree that is a great plant for attracting all kinds of wildlife. Its yellowish fruit is relished by many birds and small mammals. Spreads slowly to form colonies or thickets, providing good cover for a variety of wildlife. (H: 25', W: 15', medium growth, full to partial sun, moist well drained soils)	\$19.00		
<b>(1) Melrose Apple Tree and (1) Fuji Apple Tree:</b> (4-5') Not a RPM Tree. Two trees come with this purchase. Dwarf trees. <b>Melrose:</b> A Jonathan x Delicious cross. The red fruit is large, firm, crisp, sweet, and juicy. Melrose keeps in storage and is a premium cooking and dessert apple. Maturity date is approximately early October. <b>Fuji:</b> Developed in Japan, typically large, contain between 9-11% sugars by weight and are sweet and crisp. Fuji apples also have a very long shelf life and can remain fresh for up to 5-6 months. Maturity date is approximately early to mid October. (H: 10', W: 10', moderate to fast growth, full sun, well drained soil)	\$45.00		
<b>Pee Gee Hydrangea:</b> (1-1.5') Bold plant with large white flower clusters that last up to two months. Resistant to Japanese Beetle. Excellent in shady borders, spectacular massed. (H: 10', W: 6', fast growing, full sun to partial shade, dry to moist well drained soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Shadblow Serviceberry:</b> (1.5-3') Deciduous early-flowering, large shrub or small tree. Showy, fragrant, white spring flowers. Dark green leaves change to orange-red in autumn. Small, green berries ripen to a black in early summer. (H: 25', W 20', moderate growth rate, full sun to partial shade, moist well drained soil)	\$16.00		
<b>Red Prince Weigela:</b> (1.5-3') Has dark burgundy-purple foliage along with intense rosy pink colored flowers. (H: 5', W: 5', sun to partial shade, moist well drained soil)	\$18.00		
<b>Butterfly Milkweed:</b> (0.5' - 1') Native perennial plant that has flat-topped umbrels of nectar-rich red-orange flowers atop fleshy stems. It is a magnet for butterflies and a host plant for several butterfly varieties. (H: 1.5 - 2', slow growth, full sun, dry soil)	\$8.00		
<b>Cardinal Flower:</b> (0.5-1.0') Native perennial plant. Dozens of brilliant red flowers bloom on Cardinal Flower's strong, upright stems in late summer. Hummingbirds enjoy the nectar. (H: 2-4', full to part sun, wet to moist soils)	\$8.00		
<b>Wisteria:</b> (0.5-1') Can be grown as a small flowering tree or if left unattended will develop into a large flowering vine. Leaves are bright green. Flowers are lavender purple and fragrant. (H: 25', W: 25', full sun, moist well drained soil)	\$8.00		
<b>50-Gallon Rain Barrel:</b> "Let It Rain" with your very own recycled 50 gallon rain barrel made of polyethylene.	\$80.00		
<b>Back Porch Compost Tumbler:</b> Horizontal barrel on wheels so it can be moved around. Holds up to 37 gallons. (37" high x 26" deep x 31" wide)	\$180.00
