



This barrel is a collaborative illustration of managing earth, air, water, and soil to reduce erosion. The design illustrates how using proven land management techniques reduces soil erosion from wind and water, also how plantings of various species of trees, shrubs, grasses, and native species are beneficial to small home gardens up to mass food production. Some visuals depicted include: riparian buffer plantings for shoreline protection, terraced plantings, cross contour plantings, crop rotation, retention ponds, the planting of wind breaks using deciduous and coniferous native plants to help prevent the dust bowl affect. The animals illustrated are just a small portion of the fauna found in our area. The abundance and health of the wildlife that thrives is reflective of the land management practiced. The barrel was conceptualized by Julie Bell and three of her talented daughters - Heather Mance, Raygen Bell and Morgan Bell.
